This newsletter and probably newsletters for several more months will concentrate on the new Stratford program which is in the final phases of beta

#### stratford notes testing.

Our new "Windows-only" program is getting very mature now and has very few "showstoppers." We have additional people working on the new program now so it is progressing much faster than before.

The database is solid and has not had any significant work for more than 9 months now. We feel confident that the program is very stable.

Microsoft has formally announced the next version of the compiler that we use to create our program. It is due to be released around the first week of July. We expect it to be available for production work before the end of the summer. We have had a beta version at Stratford since early this year and have confirmed that our software is compatible with it and runs without errors. The beta version we have is extremely stable and we feel confident that the final, developer package will be ready for use. If all this is true, we plan to release our long-awaited "Windows version" sometime around the end of summer or in the fall, but, in any event, it should not be delayed any longer than October or November.

If you were one of the early beta-testers and you had some kind of problem that made you want to wait before doing any more testing, now is the time to try out the software again. You will be pleasantly

surprised with the smooth operation. Most of the performance limitations have been addressed and the program operates satisfactorily. If you have a computer with a Pentium III 600 MHz CPU or faster then you will be able to use the program easily. If you have an AMD Athlon 1.2 GHz or faster with 512 Megs of memory then you will have no problems at all with the performance. The new version is a very large, very "heavy" program with many features that will be activated over the coming years. We have plans for activating many enhancements which have been designed such as clinical information capture and integration with hand-held computers. •

## **DO CELL PHONES** CAUSE CANCER?

Cell phones have saved many lives but there is a dark side to them also.

Most of us have seen a near accident caused by someone holding a cell phone while driving. This is illegal in some countries and some states here in the USA.

Some people think that cell phones cause cancer if held next to your head.

The obvious way around both of these problems is to have a hands-free way of using the cell phone. Most cell phones

now come with an earphone in the box. In the near future, all manufacturers will probably include the ear phone as well as free replacement (like Nokia does now) in order to avoid liability.

## COMPUTER UPGRADES

If you been wondering if that old computer of yours will run the new Stratford windows-only software, then you should look at some of the hardware bargains that are available now. As you may already know, the new version is very "heavy" (the latest computer terminology). In other words, it has a lot of new features that require a much more powerful computer than the dos-compiled version. This is true even though they both run best on Windows 9x/NT/2000. There are many graphical elements and the database has been redesigned to make it more usable for custom reporting by people who are not programmers or "techietypes."

It has support for 2 CPU's, 133MHz memory bus, 64-bit technology, nine drive bays, room for 2GB memory. The processor is a 933MHz Pentium III with 256K Cache. The hard drive is a 9GB Ultra SCSI 7200 RPM. You may not know what all this means, but suffice it to say this is a powerful computer that will work great as a server for the new Stratford program. At the time we looked this up on the Internet the price was \$999 but it was possible to get the price down to \$500 if you selected the \$400 promotion and took one year on-site maintenance instead of three years. To get the promotions you would need to select the "Customize it" options.

This specific deal may not be available when you read this, but you can be sure there will be similar deals by all the major hardware manufacturers such as Dell and Gateway.

Before you buy, you may wish to fax the computer hardware configuration specifications and price to Stratford at (650) 692 1073 and we will look it over for you.
